22nd NOVEMBER 2024 – The Ministry of Tourism, Arts, and Culture (MOTAC) through the National Art Gallery presents the "JADE Exhibition: A Journey Across Millennia of Dedication to Enduring Prosperity" from 23rd November to 23rd December 2024 at the National Art Gallery. This exhibition is brought to you by the Malaysian Chinese Cultural Society in conjunction of the 50th anniversary of diplomatic relations between Malaysia and China.
